! Deer Park opens from dawn to dusk, all year round.
Please take care on the trails due to areas of uneven ground.
There are no food/drink outlets and no toilet facilities in the Deer Park, so please plan ahead.

? Why not bring a picnic to enjoy in the Water Meadows? Or buy items from The Green Table or Roundhouse cafés on your way? As a courtesy to other visitors (and wildlife), please dispose of your rubbish responsibly – thank you.

✓ Comfortable, sturdy shoes essential – riverside areas can get muddy!
Camera, water, sunscreen, hat etc.
Dogs are welcome on the estate but must be kept under close control and always on leads around livestock and between 1 March – 31 July (ground-nesting bird season).
