The shops have re-opened, with a return of a familiar name to many, The Cider Press Centre, which we felt better reflected our passion for local food, arts and crafts. The Green Table Deli is our latest addition, run by Pip Vaughan-Hughes (yes – food is a family affair here) with its mouth-watering ethically and locally produced charcuterie, cheeses, crackers and condiments. It also serves freshly made sandwiches, soups, great coffee, tea and soft drinks.

Our programme of **short courses** has also returned including sculpting, bookbinding, printmaking, poetry and even creating your own herbal medicines. We're also really excited to host **both a course and a concert with Black Voices Gospel Choir** – the latter our first indoor live music event for over a year! We're working behind the scenes on a spring festival – 'Thrive' – at the end of May (details coming soon – keep an eye on the website for that one). Plenty more events are coming up, too, including a Member Gardens Tea Party – see the 'events' section below for more.

Looking ahead to June, we're hopeful more restrictions will be relaxed and we can fully open up all our events on the estate from June 21. Whatever happens, we're enormously grateful for your ongoing support, as ever, and hope to see you here soon!

OUR GARDENS REOPEN

Our gardens and conservation team have worked incredibly hard ahead of the re-opening of our new-look Grade II* listed gardens. Improvements include making the gardens more accessible for wheelchair users and buggies with step-free access routes running all the way to the Whispering Circle, as well a new children's activity trail. There are also new interpretation boards revealing more of the rich history of the gardens, including our treasured 'Champion Trees'.

The decision to charge was a difficult one, but maintaining the grounds to a high standard is costly. However we have listened to visitors' feedback and have decided to reduce prices making the gardens more accessible to locals and those who are on a very low income. We also plan to hold 'open house' free days' twice a year.

The gardens continue to be free for members, and you are also welcome to bring a guest. We will also be reaching out to members who visit to provide feedback on their experience (keep an eye on your inbox for details).

STUDENTS RETURN TO THE ESTATE, AS OUR 30TH ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATIONS CONTINUE

It's a particularly special year for Schumacher College as it celebrates 30 years of progressive education around ecology and sustainability. A programme of events and initiatives is ongoing, spearheaded by our Bursary Campaign, which aims to equip the next generation with the tools to address the social, environmental and economic challenges we all face.

With all that's happening, we're delighted to finally welcome our current students back on site, with students on a six-month horticulture residency studying alongside those on our brand new Engaged Ecology MA at Schumacher College. In addition, students from the Dartington Arts School are now with us for our unique MA Arts and Place course – on which they get the chance to create work at five different locations around the UK (including an off-grid tree house in Scotland!). And we are still taking applications for the UK's first ever degree in sustainable farming, our BSc Regenerative Food and Farming.



OUR PLEA FOR DOG OWNERS TO TAKE CARE

Lockdown has not been without its challenges – with sadly a few people not caring for the estate as you our members, and most of our visitors. We've had problems with people dropping litter, not picking up after their dog and sometimes causing damage.

This has been particularly worrying as we still have vulnerable students from Bidwell Brook who have been temporarily using Hex, so they can study in smaller school are in a school 'bubble' until the end of July. We've also sadly had two deer killed by people allowing their dogs off the leash on the estate and one of our tenant farmers, Jon Perkin has found the last year particularly tough – you can **read more here**.


